Unit 9, Lesson A: Grammar
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Positive Sentence +, + **and** + **Subject** + **Positive Helping Verb** +, + **too** +.
Negative Sentence +, + **and** + **Subject** + **Negative Helping Verb** +, + **either** +.
Positive Sentence +, + **but** + **Subject** + **Negative Helping Verb** +.
Negative Sentence +, + **but** + **Subject** + **Positive Helping Verb** +.

Point:

We use "too" in positive sentences, but we use "either" in negative sentences.

Examples:

Robert and Jennifer are doctors. Mary is a nurse.

- *Robert is a doctor, **and** Jennifer is, **too**.*
- *Robert isn't a nurse, **and** Jennifer isn't, **either**.*
- *Robert is a doctor, **but** Mary isn't.*
- *Robert isn't a nurse, **but** Mary is.*

Robert and Mary work in a hospital. Jennifer works in a clinic.

- *Robert works in a hospital, **and** Mary does, **too**.*
- *Robert doesn't work in a clinic, **and** Mary doesn't, **either**.*
- *Robert works in a hospital, **but** Jennifer doesn't.*
- *Robert doesn't work in a clinic, **but** Jennifer does.*

Robert and Mary worked in a hospital. Jennifer worked in a clinic.

- *Robert worked in a hospital, **and** Mary did, **too**.*
- *Robert didn't work in a clinic, **and** Mary didn't, **either**.*
- *Robert worked in a hospital, **but** Jennifer didn't.*
- *Robert didn't work in a clinic, **but** Jennifer did.*
