escape = run away, run off

- *In the TV series "Prison Break", Michael Scofield and his brother escaped from the prison.*

jump = to push yourself suddenly off the ground and into the air using your legs

- *How high can you jump?*
- *How far can you jump?*
- *The children were jumping up and down with excitement.*

quit = give up, abandon

- *When are you going to quit smoking?*

**Point:** The past form of quit is irregular in American English, but regular in British English.

quit ⇒ quit (American)

quit ⇒ quitted (British)

Examples:

*John quit his job two months ago.* ⇒ American

*John quitted his job two months ago.* ⇒ British

sneeze = When you sneeze, air and often small drops of liquid suddenly come out of your nose and mouth in a way you cannot control

- *When someone sneezes, we usually say, "Bless you!"*
- *Cats make him sneeze - I think he's allergic to them.*

temperature = how hot or cold something is

forecast = prediction = saying what will happen in the future

- *The weather forecast said it was going to rain later today.*
