feel like + Verb+ing

feel like = want = حس انجام کاری را داشتن

- Do you feel like going to the park with us this evening?
- Do you feel like playing soccer with us this afternoon?

What about + Verb+ing

How about+ Verb+ing

- What about going to the park with us this evening?
- How about playing soccer with us this afternoon?

want + Infinitive

Infinitive = to + Simple Form of the Verb

- Do you want to go out to the park with us this evening?
- Do you want to play soccer with us this afternoon?

would like + Infinitive

- Would you like to go out to the park with us this evening?
- Would you like to play soccer with us this afternoon?

"Would like" has the same meaning as "want", but it is politer.
politer = مودبانه‌تر

Accepting an Invitation:

Yes, I'd love to.

Yes, by all means.

- by all means = با کمال میل

OK. That's a good idea.

Refusing an Invitation:

I'm sorry I can't. I have to

I'm afraid I can't. I have to

I'd love to. But I have to

Point:

After “I have to”, we give an excuse.

Excuse = the reason why we can't do something = بهانه

I have to visit my uncle.

I have to go to school.

I have to help my parents.
