faucet (American) = tap (British)

- *The faucet is on.* = Water is running from the faucet.
- *The faucet is off.* = Water is not running from the faucet.
- *I turned on the faucet.*
- *I turned off the faucet.*

garbage (American) = rubbish (British)

grateful = thankful

- *We should be grateful to God.*

hang up = hang from a hook

hang up → hung up

- *Robert hung up his coat in the closet.*
- *Your shirt is hanging up behind the door.*

hold = keep

hold → held

- *She was holding a brown suitcase.*
- *Will you please hold the books for me.*

put away = put aside; store things that you no longer need

- *I washed the pan and then, I put it away.*

out = not burning

- *The candle is out.*

go out = stop burning

- *The candle went out in the wind.*

put out = extinguish; make something stop burning

- *The wind put out the candle.*
- *The firefighters are trying to put out the fire.*

take off ≠ put on

take off = remove a piece of clothing or shoes from your body

put on = put a piece of clothing or shoes on your body

wear = have a piece of clothing or shoes on your body

- *Tom is wearing a blue shirt now. He put it on half an hour ago. He is going to take it off when he goes back home.*
