admit = confess

- *Jack admitted that he was wrong.*

complicated = complex ≠ simple

- *A computer is a complicated electronic device.*

courage (noun) = bravery

- *Colonel Henderson was famous for his courage during the war.*

courageous (adjective) = brave

- *Colonel Henderson was very courageous during the war.*

courageously (adverb) = bravely

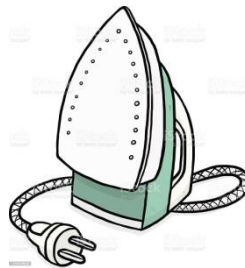
- *Colonel Henderson fought very courageously during the war.*
- fight ⇔ fought, fought

cut = decrease

disappear = vanish ≠ appear

gain ≠ lose



a steam iron

iron (noun) = a tool with a flat metal base that can be heated and used to make clothes smooth

- *The iron is too hot. Please be careful when you use it!*

iron (verb) = to make clothes, etc. smooth by using an iron

- *A drycleaner irons our clothes.*
- *We iron our clothes with an electric steam iron.*
- *He was ironing when I arrived.*
- *I'll need to iron that dress before I can wear it.*

notice ≠ overlook

notice = to see or hear somebody/something; to become aware of somebody/something

- *I noticed a change in the arrangement of the rival soccer team.*
- *People were making fun of him but he didn't seem to notice.*
- *The first thing I noticed about the room was the smell.*
- *I began to notice something strange.*
- *Most people never notice these details.*
- *Did you notice how Rachel kept looking at her watch?*
- *I didn't notice him leaving.*

obey = follow = to do what you are told or expected to do ≠ disobey

- *The Japanese employees usually obey the orders of their managers very carefully.*
- *He always obeys his parents without question.*
- *The soldiers in the army obey the orders blindly.*

outgoing = sociable ≠ shy

predict (verb) = to say that something will happen in the future

- *How do you predict tomorrow's weather?*
- *Nobody could predict the outcome.*
- *He predicts a bright future for the business in the next financial year.*
- *It is impossible to predict what will happen.*

prediction (noun) = saying what will happen in the future

- *His prediction was quite unrealistic.*

make fun of = ridicule

- *Please don't make fun of your friends!*
