**breed** = reproduce = to mate and produce young children

*The blackbird, like most birds, breeds in the spring.*

**breed** = grow animals = to keep animals for the purpose of producing young animals in a controlled way

*Mr. Thompson breeds camels on his farm.*

*Terriers are bred for their fighting instincts.*

*His main income comes from breeding cattle.*

**breed** → bred, bred

**breeder** = a person who grows animals or plants

*She was one of the country's top sheep breeders.*

**capture** = to take someone as a prisoner, or to take something into your possession, especially by force

*Two of the soldiers were killed and the rest were captured.*

*Rebel forces captured the city after a week-long battle.*

**crawl** = to move along on hands and knees or with your body stretched out along a surface

*The child crawled across the floor.*

*Megan has just learned to crawl.*

*The injured soldier crawled to safety.*

*He had to crawl along a ledge and get in through a window.*

**danger** (noun) = something that may harm you

**dangerous** (adjective) = not safe

**endanger** (verb) = put somebody or something in danger

*He would never do anything to endanger the lives of his children.*

*We must be careful not to do anything that might endanger the economic recovery.*

**endangered** (adjective) = in danger of being harmed, lost, unsuccessful, etc.

*The new government in this African country plans to protect the endangered species.*

**fertile** (adjective) = productive; able to produce children

*People get less fertile as they get older.*

*In order to turn the deserts into fertile and productive land, engineers built an 800-mile canal.*

**fertility** (noun) = productivity; the ability to produce children

**fertilize** (verb) = make the soil rich; enable an animal to produce children

**fertilizer** (noun) = a material that farmers use to fertilize the soil

**habitat** = an area where wild animals live

*With so many areas of woodland being cut down, a lot of wildlife is losing its natural habitat.*

**leap** ➔ leaped, leaped

**leap** ➔ leapt, leapt

**raise** (verb) = lift ⇔ /reɪz/

*Please raise your hand before you speak in the class!*

**rise** (verb) = go up ⇔ /raɪz/

*Prices are rising because of the high rate of inflation in this country.*

**spot** (verb) = notice, discern, observe

*Scientists have spotted a change in the temperature of the oceans.*

**spot** (noun) = a location, a place, a point

*Tom was sleeping in a nice spot on the grass in the shade of a tree.*
