## **Imperatives in Conditional Sentences Type I**

An imperative can function as the main clause of a conditional sentence type I. An imperative is a sentence which is a command or an order such as “Open the door.”, “Don’t close the window.”, “Let’s go.”, etc.

Examples:

- *If you see Joe Jackson, **kill him on the spot.***
- *If you see your grandpa, **remember me to him.***
- *If you’re not busy, **let’s go to the park and take a walk.***
- *If you have a stomachache, **drink some peppermint water.***
- *If you see a beautiful flower, **don’t pick it.***
- *If it is cold outside, **don’t open the window.***

**New Words & Expressions:**

- **on the spot** = immediately
- **remember me to him** = give him my regards = say hi to him
